#### **Steve Cook**


Executing Affordable Space Transportation Systems: Applying Lessons Learned from Past Programs

Abstract: Today, the U.S. is in the unseemly position of having to rely on the Russian government for human access to space. How did we get in this position? Since the development of the Space Shuttle, the U.S. has struggled with taking the next steps in space transportation development. Some estimates indicate that over \$80 billion has been expended in trying to replace the Shuttle – and we have yet to fly the successor. This session will explore lessons learned from previous transportation system developments and will present approaches that may enable more affordable and rapid development of space systems in the future.

Biography: Steve Cook is Director of Space Technologies at Dynetics headquartered in Huntsville, Ala. He was selected for the position in September 2009 to lead Dynetics' efforts in launch systems, orbital spacecraft and analysis, planetary exploration and nanotechnology research. Cook is responsible for overseeing Dynetics' efforts in advanced propulsion development and launch systems development, including integration support and hardware to Paul G. Allen's Stratolaunch Systems and NASA's Space Launch System, the FASTSAT commercial satellite system, and NASA and Google Lunar X PRIZE planetary lander demonstrations. From September 2005 until September 2009, Cook served as manager of the Ares Projects Office at NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville. He was responsible for overall project management and direction of NASA's Ares Land V launch vehicles.

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## Doug Krug

New Results Require New Thinking: How to Create More of the Future You Want

**Abstract:** It's a simple premise actually – the results any of us are getting today are what happens when doing it the way we have so far. The next step also seems like a 'Duh!' – if we want different outcomes, we'll have to do something different.

If there were *one thing* that we could all do to create more of what we wanted, what would be the benefits for you at work and at home?

Reconnect with this one factor in our lives that influences everything we do all day, every day; yet, has become virtually *invisible through familiarity*® .

Biography: Doug Krug's primary role is helping top executive teams create and sustain the focus and alignment essential to successfully deal with today's most pressing leadership challenges. This includes three Governor's Cabinets, the top executive teams at FBI, Medicare/Medicaid, U.S. Marshals and all 50 Admirals in the Coast Guard; as well as numerous executive teams in the corporate arena. The essence of Doug's work is built around the premise that the core of what makes an effective and inspiring leader cannot be taught, not in the traditional sense; it has to be brought out from within. Doug served as part of the MBA Program at Johns Hopkins University's Division of Public Safety Leadership for 15 years. This includes IRS, FBI, DEA, Veterans Affairs, Center for Disease Control, Secret Service, Office of Personnel Management, NASA, Department of Interior and Department of Labor. With a diverse career as an entrepreneur and management consultant, Doug has proven skills for effectively creating powerful organizational results. Through 'enter-trainment', Doug provides inspiration and information, giving participants tools that are immediately applicable.

Abstract: In this session Emma will be blowing apart the myth that Change is difficult - or that 'people hate Change'. As they say in Britain - "Cobblers!". Of course people like Change. How many people do you know that have never moved house, bought a new car or been on holiday? Quite! In this session Emma will share stories and approaches for an InThinking approach to Change Management. Emma drew much of her Change inspiration from the way her dog interacted with her adopted sons, when they first came home. She has also tested them out her dog's ideas many workplaces, from the UK to the Middle East. And they seem to work. This meeting will introduce multiple tools and the thinking models behind them. Audiences for his classes have also reached after-school program in elementary schools, graduate students at Northwestern University, as well as corporate, university, and public classes across the United Kingdom.

He conducts training and consulting aimed at better understanding cause-effect relationships, processes, improvement potentials, opportunities and risks.

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
#### Jennifer Shepherd

The Art of Reflection

Abstract: Reflection is both a private and public practice that requires an investment of skill and time to produce insights that inspire better action. Like other arts, developing a skilled practice of reflection requires, well, practice! In this workshop, we will use the visual art created for this year's In2:InThinking Network Forum as a creative stimulus to explore the relationships between reflection, connection, inspiration, and action. This exploration will spark a collective, conscious inquiry into the practical utility of individual and collective reflection. Building on what we learn together, we will consider the power and potential of graphic facilitation as a methodology to grow our capacity to practice the art of reflection at the Forum, at work, and in our home communities.

Biography: Jennifer Shepherd is the founder of Living Tapestries, a consulting firm that helps everyday leaders develop and connect ideas faster so they can focus their time on what really matters. Blending solid engagement processes with arts-based methods, Jennifer custom designs and facilitates meetings that take organizations on a journey of discovery and learning and invite people to challenge their current thinking, generate insight and take inspired action. When clients struggle to communicate their strategic plans, team visions, and product concepts to others, Jennifer works with them to create a hand-crafted visual aid that does the job for them. #### **Barry Oshry**

The Accidental Theoretician And His Most Practical Findings

**Abstract**:In this presentation, Barry Oshry will trace the path he has been on since 1960, a path that has led to the development of the Organic Systems Framework, a framework that enables system members to see, understand, and navigate their ways productively through the many systems of their lives. He will describe how this theory has gradually evolved, tracing its history from his first eye-opening encounter with experience-based learning, to his large-scale classroom experiments at Boston University and elsewhere, and ultimately to the Power Lab and the Organization Workshop – two programs designed for others' learning that also served as his basic R&D learning laboratories about organic systems. Barry will take us into the essence of this framework.

Biography: Barry Oshry is a distinguished educator and a pioneer in the field of human systems thinking. His research, writing and teaching have focused on the human systems dynamics arising when people are in top, middle, bottom, and customer relationships with one another. He's been exploring with special interest the issue of "middles" in organizations, and he's written extensively on the subject. His research has also led him to investigate the dynamics at play when dominant cultures interact with "other" cultures. Barry received his Ph.D. from Boston University where he later taught and was Chairman of the Department of Organization Studies. He is the developer of the Power Lab, a weeklong total immersion leadership development experience, the Organization Workshop on Creating Partnership, and When Cultures Meet. Barry is the author of Seeing Systems, Leading Systems, and In The Middle. He is also a playwright whose stage productions include "What A Way To Make A Living," "Hierarchy" and "Peace." Since 1975 he's been President of Power+ Systems Training, Inc. in Boston, which he founded with his wife and partner, Karen Ellis Oshry.

This presentation will explore some potential traps in failure analysis and how you might avoid them by refining *your art of reflection*.




Dominate Your Life

**Abstract**: In this session we'll delve into the practice of Mindful Awareness, the timetested tool for taming the mind from the Buddhist tradition. Mindful Awareness is just noticing whatever arises in our experience, without comment, judgment or evaluation. It is simply being, without having to *do* anything about how we're being. Whatever thoughts, feelings or emotions arise, the practice is to be with them, to feel them without doing anything about them. Instead of running away from or trying to get rid of anything, stay with the thoughts and emotions and look into them. Just staying in the here and now in this way is an expression of bravery.

**Biography**: Joseph ("Joe") Parent has coached Performance Psychology for business, life and golf for over 30 years. After completing his Ph.D. in psychology in 1979, Joe trained in the tradition of Mindful Awareness practice, developing a unique blend of modern western psychology and venerable eastern wisdom for stress management and skill development. He has become a renowned and sought-after consultant teaching the path to success through peak performance principles. #### Henrik Minassians

To Reflect or Not to Reflect: Can the Public Sector Shift Paradigms?

Abstract: It is widely believed by the public lately that the "public sector" is a behemoth "prevailing style of management" (also known to members of the In2:InThinking Network as a "Red Pen Company") bureaucracy, incapable of innovation and strategic vision. "Public mangers," therefore, are nothing more than life-tenured "career bureaucrats" who are committed to upholding and reinforcing antiquated hierarchical organizational paradigms. Shifting population dynamics, coupled with scarce budgetary resources, has meant that public sector organizations are being forced to do much more with much less than ever before. Vigorous movements to deregulate, privatize and contract-out, to partner, and more recently, to re-regulate and even nationalize, have inspired a growing interest in inter-organizational networks of actors spanning the public, private and nonprofit sectors. Collectively, these developments have inspired many officials and high-level public managers to search out new governing models and shift from current paradigms. With that said, old paradigms and mental models are being shattered as civic and public leaders serving in Los Angeles County have been shifting their views on the role of public sector agency toward crafting and implementing strategic missions that are focused on creating public value. This shift is being facilitated by the county's comprehensive commitment to becoming a "learning organization," where existing public employees are meant to be transformed into higher-order thinking organizational leaders who will charged with carrying out these missions in fiercely challenging political and economic environments

**Biography:** Henrik Minassians is the Director of Regional/National Educational Partnerships & Services for Graduate & Professional Educational Services and Programs at The Tseng College, California State University, Northridge. He also teaches courses in Public Policy and Administration at CSUN. His research interests include implementation and evaluation issues in higher education and health care policy. His applied research has focused on accountability programs in higher education and the effectiveness of indicators used for performance measurement. Dr. Minassians has written on the implementation of public programs in higher education and healthcare.



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
